Focus: Killinghall Study

- I can say which county, country and continent Killinghall is in.
- I can find Killinghall on different types of maps.
- I can talk about the key human and physical features of Killinghall: the village hall, the church, Killinghall Moor, the River Nidd and Oak Beck.

Focus: India

- I can compare India with the UK and say what is similar or different.
- I can describe physical differences between the UK and India, e.g. climate and landforms.
- I can use geographical vocabulary to describe key physical features in the UK or India, like beaches, cliffs, forests, mountains and seas.
- I can use geographical vocabulary to describe key human features in the UK or India, like cities, towns, factories, farms, houses and offices.

Focus: Weather Patterns

- I can identify, describe and explain patterns in local and global weather data.
- I can say how weather affects other global patterns such as trade or land use.
- I can describe the human and physical impacts of extreme weather.
- I can measure weather around school and explain why it's different in some areas.
- I can name the 7 continents and 5 oceans of the world, and find them on a world map.
- I know the names and locations of the 4 countries of the UK, their capital cities and the seas surrounding them.

Focus: Geography Skills

- I know the 4 simple compass directions (north, east, south, west) and can use them to describe and follow routes on a map.
- I can identify and draw key human and physical features like rivers, buildings and forests on from aerial views.
- I can compare aerial photos with maps and add what is missing.
- I can make my own simple map with a basic key.
- I can use equipment to learn about the geography of my school and the area around it.
