Maths

We will be moving our learning on from place value to the four operations this week starting with addition and subtraction methods and using the inverse to solve problems.

Mrs Linfoot will continue to support the children's prior knowledge of arithmetic by focussing on short multiplication – this will be building on their knowledge from the work on times tables

English

This week our English sessions will be focussed on Black History and investigating some less well-known role models from history. The children will then write a biography of the role model they have chosen to focus on. I am looking forward to reading their finished pieces.

We will be continuing with our new spelling scheme which the children seem to be enjoying.

History

This week the children will learn about the mummification process and the role of a Canopic Jar. The next week, the children will learn about the first pharaoh, Narmer, and his significance during this time.

Science

Over the next couple of weeks the children will be developing understanding of the theories of evolution and how fossils have helped us to picture what life might have been like millions of years ago.
